

## Pakistan-Trento

J was the pastor of a church in Pakistan who, due to various threats, was forced to flee the country. After a few adventures, he arrived at Trento 18 months ago with just the clothes he was wearing. Eventually the church was put in contact with him, and we helped him practically and with the paperwork he had to do. After about a year, he was granted asylum, and last December his wife and son, who had been in hiding in Pakistan, joined him. Now that J's situation has become legal and almost normal, he is looking at how he can serve where God has put him, and the church at how we can help him. He has already travelled a bit around Italy to help various immigrant churches, especially from the Indian sub-continent. In fact, on Good Friday there will be a service in our hall for Indians and Pakistani at Trento, which will be a first for us. He could also have a good input in discussions on religious freedom. So last Thursday the church organised a public meeting on this theme in which he spoke, as well as representatives of the provincial government and the Catholic Church. Unexpectedly, there were also five Muslim Pakistani students, who spoke a fair bit and contested what J was saying was the situation in Pakistan. They did create some anxious moments as they took many notes on the meeting, but J continued regardless. This week he will also be at Geneva to participate in some discussions of the United Nations on religious freedom.

As you may know, there was another outbreak of violence against Christians in Pakistan this week, which obviously upset J and his wife. So there was also an opportunity to manifest our fellowship with the persecuted church through the

encouragement and support of this family. Pray for J, his ministry, his family as they adjust to a new country, and for the church as we try to help him and follow where God leads us, towards ministries we were not expecting.

## Women's meeting

Last Saturday there was a women's meeting, which Pinuccia helped to organize with a few others. It was an opportunity to witness to many of the church members' friends, as three ladies spoke on anxiety and worry, including the wife of the Pakistani pastor. It was good to be able to use our own hall for such activities, that we could not do in the past. Pray that these events will help our continuing witness, both in the public sphere and towards our individual friends.

Daniela is one of the three teachers, together with Pinuccia, in the Sunday School class for the smaller children, whilst Andrea co-leads one of the Bible study groups and is also doing the training to lead the service.
