

One ministry that I mentioned in my last newsletter that did not go ahead was the course on Christian Personal Development, which was supposed to have four monthly meetings from October to January. Unfortunately Pinuccia's friend who will be running the course had health problems in her family that she had to deal with, and the course was postponed to sometime in 2024.

A special meeting in the Rovereto church that I found encouraging was an evening that had been planned as a praise night to practice singing some of the church songs, but turned out to be quite different. The hall was packed as some came from the Trento church to join us. In particular, the teenagers of the two churches came instead of having their usual meeting, lowering the average age and raising the average energy of the meeting. We told everyone that they could bring an item to praise God if they wanted to, which meant that the music group only played four songs. Two people brought texts to read, Pinuccia read a poem she had composed some years ago, the children sang a song, the teenagers played two songs for all to sing (the first time they had played for others), the Pakistanis played and sang a song in Urdu, others presented a brief message or prayer, and in small groups we thanked God for what he had done for each one of us personally. It had become a celebration of diversity, creativity, and fellowship in worship.

On the computer

Last month I finished my latest project for my Italian Bible site *LaParola*. Starting from some open source code, I worked for several months correcting errors in the code, modifying it so it was more multilingual with a bias towards Italian, and converting the texts I already use to the format that the code uses. Previously (ie for the past 22 years – it was about time the site was updated!), a user would type in the reference to a Bible passage and a page would be opened with the text. If they wanted to see the context of the passage or another passage, they had to start again typing another reference. In this new section of the site there is a continuous text, so the user can scroll up and down to read more. There are many more new functions in this new part of the site, but since it displays in English to people with an English operating system, you can try it yourself at https://www.laparola.net/app/ Some hints: If you click the three horizontal lines at the top left of the site, you will find some of the extra functions. If you click a commentary name to change it, you will find two of the resources (BDB, MNT) I created myself, rather than just receiving or translating.

Computer Corner
